STP

- Expansion of STP commissions in Physiological Sciences 2023/24 30 extra per year
- New curricula for 2022
- Portal now closed for 2023/24 entry

HSST

- Expansion of HSST commissions in Physiological Sciences 2023/24 20 extra per year
- Portal now closed for 2023/24 entry

Echocardiography Training Programme

18 month funded PGCert and work-based training to BSE accreditation

- Pilot September 2020 12 trainees, 11 fully complete reviewed, amendments in discussion
- 2021 cohort 57 trainees
- 2022 cohort 65 trainees
- 2023 cohort EOI closed, 83 approved
- Extra HEI sought for 2023 intake
