ASP Assessment planning

Assessment format

- Introduction to GI
- Upper GI
- Lower GI
- = 4 different permutations
- 4 new professional discussion elements per assessment (minimum)
- = 12 new elements per assessment

Assessment implementation

- Each PD element lasts
 10 minutes
- Requires preparation of at least 3 briefing documents
- Many include 2-3 artefacts
- Developed by specialty assessors
- Recruit panel of 3 assessors

ASP delivery (virtual)

- Assessment = 4 x 10 minute PD elements
- Each has a pre-read time
- Complex scheduling
- Technical issues around sharing assessment materials (email/sharepoint/ share screen)
- Many technical issues

IAPS Assessment planning

Assessment format

- Specialist paper
- Showcase portfolio
- Panel of 3 examiners
- Each candidate must notify of intention to submit in advance
- Each assessment lasts 4 hours

Assessment implementation

- Selection of specialist papers for each specialty
- Review of showcase to ensure meets requirements
- Recruitment of 3 specialist examiners at consultant level

IAPS delivery (virtual)

- Virtual panel
- 2 per day per specialty
- 2 specialties per day maximum
- Difficulty in scaling.

- Recruiting sufficient specialist examiners and assessors
- Generating the specialty specific assessment materials needed for each assessment
- Technical issues
 - Virtual sharing of complex information
 - Developing a scalable solution to providing examiner/ assessor access to candidate/trainee submissions
 - Real-time assessment incidents

 - Lightweight model of external assessment in the workplace
 - Revised approach to progression review
 - New end point assessment (replacing the IACC)
