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

What is an Enhanced Clinical Practitioner?

- 'Think' Extended Scope Practitioner
 - Not quite ready to think about Advancing Practice
 - Emerging Leaders moving into the 'Senior Role'
 - Supervision, Teaching and Learning
 - Specialising within a dedicated field or working within a particular clinic
 - Standardising the workforce, planned progression activity



Enhanced Clinical Practice Apprenticeship

- Study Mode: Distance
- **Duration:** 13 months
- Fee: £7000 including End Point Assessment (EPA)
- EPAO: National School for Healthcare Science
- Off the Job Training: Minimum 6 hours

 Qualification: PgCert Enhanced Clinical Practice (i.e Physiological Science)

- Minimum 2 year post qualification

Structure

- Postgraduate Certificate (Level 7)
 - 60 Credits
 - 30 Credit Enhancing Practice (Employer Led Practice Based Learning)
 - 15 Credit Leadership for Enhanced Practice
 - 15 credit Clinical Reasoning and Decision Making
 - 0 Credit Preparation for End Point Assessment
 - September, January and May intake
 - Asynchronous Delivery
 - Synchronous Tutorial
 - Bespoke Practice Assessment Document
 - Employer Led and Flexible

Defining the Scope

- Think about...
 - What do you want them to do?
 - How will it help and support the service?
- Employer Led, co-designed and co-produced
- Electronic Portfolio
 - Includes, in relation to area of practice
 - Leadership
 - Clinical Reasoning
 - Decision Making



End Point Assessment

- For successful completion of the apprenticeship, <u>all</u> learners are required to undertake the End Point Assessment
- You must be satisfied that they are working consistently <u>at or above</u> the level set out in the occupational standard
- The EPA consists of two components:
 - 1. Quality Improvement Proposal Report
 - 2. Professional Discussion
- Employers are encouraged to contribute to the module by sitting on mock interview panels.
- EPA can be hosted at the University or at the NSHCS



How is this funded?

- Levy Funded (Wage bill of more than £3million (0.5% employers annual bill))
- Co-invest (95%:5%)
